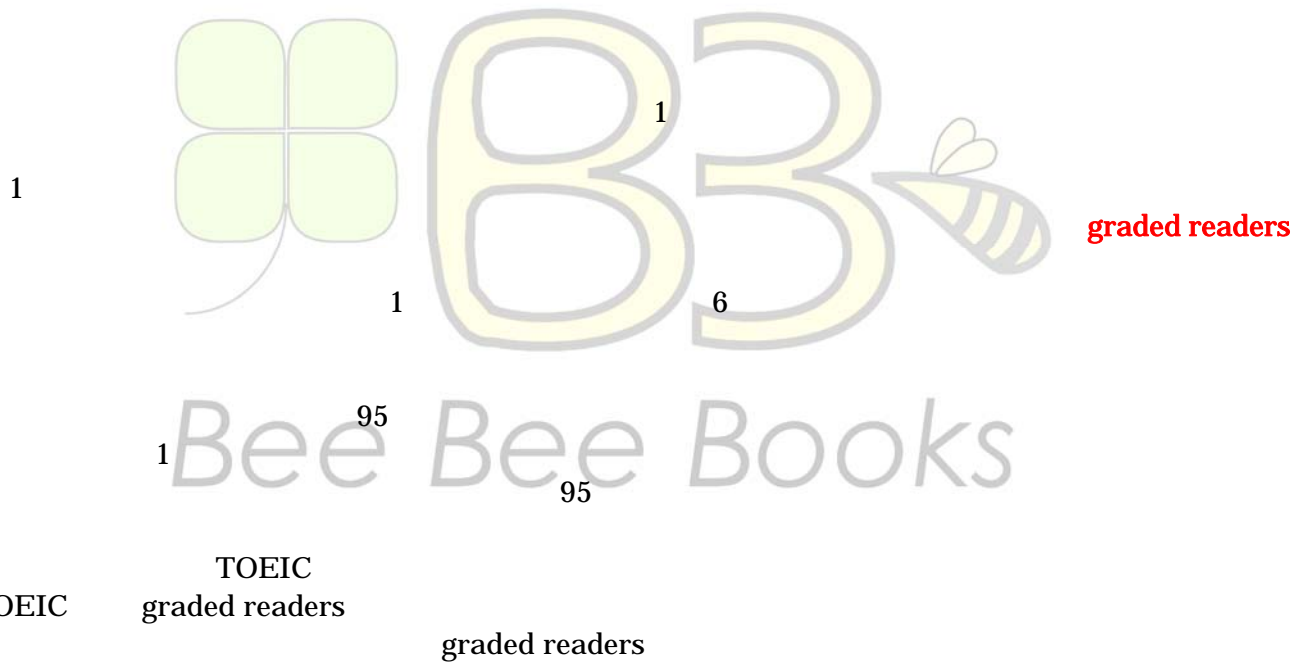

Improve your English through reading.

Many students ask me how they can improve their English. Of course, you must take as many English classes as possible, and you **MUST** do your homework. But, what about during summer vacation? Since there are few classes during summer vacation, one way to improve your English is through reading. When I mention 'reading,' many students think of short, but difficult passages, like a newspaper article. This is one type of reading, but not the only type. Another type of reading is to read a lot of simple books. In the library, we have many such books. They are called 'graded readers' and were written for second language learners, such as yourself. In the library, these books are divided according to levels. Level 1 books are the easiest and level 6 are the hardest. But, how do you choose a book? When choosing a book, it must interest you. Who wants to read a boring book? Second, it must be easy. You should know about 95% of the words. To determine this, read the first page and write down the words you don't know. Then count the number of words on the page. If you know 95% of the words or more, this is a good start. Now, read. Read. And **READ**. Students who read lots score better on tests. Of course, you still need to study if your goal is a high score on the TOEIC test because some of the vocabulary on the TOEIC test (marketing) does not come up in graded readers. But if your goal is to improve your general English ability, these books are an effective and fun way to do it.
